At each Mass couples will be invited to pray for their spouses... don't worry all couples will have cards with the prayers on them... in our society that keeps pushing the perfect gift for one's spouse, maybe a prayer of appreciation and thanksgiving may send an important message not only to each other, but to children and grandchildren... please feel free to invite the whole family to join you that weekend...

Lenten Regulations 2012

The entire season of Lent, from **Ash Wednesday, February 22nd to Holy Thursday, April 5th** is a penitential season, a time for self-denial, prayer and Christian charity. During this season, you are strongly encouraged to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion daily, to receive the Sacrament of Penance, to attend Lenten devotions and the Stations of the Cross, to read the Scriptures prayerfully, and to perform acts of self-denial and works of mercy.

The specific discipline of the Church in the United States regarding penitential days is as follows:

- The days of **fast and abstinence** are **ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY**.
- The other **Fridays of Lent** are **DAYS OF ASTINENCE**.
- The **Fridays of the year, outside of Lent**, are designated as **DAYS OF PENANCE**, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance. This may be a physical mortification or acts of religion, charity or Christian witness.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast. By this obligation, the individual is permitted only one full meal a day.

At the age of 14, people are obligated to abstain. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Please join us for Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent beginning on February 24th at 7 p.m. in the church.
